

ICVCM Core Carbon Principles (CCP) Label Guidance

12 December 2024



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1 INTRODUCTION

The VCS Program allows VCUs to be designated with Labels. See the <u>VCS Program</u> and the <u>VCS Labels</u> websites for details on label requirements and processes.

This document explains how Verified Carbon Units (VCUs) under the Verified Carbon Standard (VCS) Program may receive labels to indicate that they meet the requirements of the *Core Carbon Principles* (CCPs) published by the *Integrity Council for the Voluntary Carbon Market* (ICVCM)

ICVCM CCP labels are optional under the VCS Program.

This document may be updated to align with VCS Program updates and the Integrity Council for the Voluntary Carbon Market's <u>Assessment Framework</u>, including but not limited to future clarifications by the ICVCM. Readers must ensure that they are using the most recent version of this document.

2 BACKGROUND

The ICVCM <u>Core Carbon Principles (CCPs)</u> are a global benchmark for high-integrity carbon credits that set rigorous thresholds on disclosure and sustainable development.

The principles were developed by the ICVCM with input from hundreds of organizations throughout the voluntary carbon market. ICVCM has established the CCP <u>Assessment Framework</u> as the basis for assessing applicant carbon-crediting programs and methodologies. The assessment results are periodically published on the ICVCM website. The ICVCM assesses which carbon-crediting programs are approved to label credits with a CCP Label, as well as which credit types are eligible for CCP labels.

The ICVCM has also published an <u>ICVCM Tagging Manual for CCP Eligible Programs</u>. This guidance document addresses the requirements of the tagging manual¹.

The ICVCM approved the VCS Program as CCP Eligible on April 25, 2024.

A VCU may hold a CCP Label if it meets all eligibility requirements, set out in Section 3.

¹ Note that other labels available for VCUs are independent of CCP labels, and are not considered CCP Attribute tags.



3 CCP LABEL ELIGIBILITY

Eligible Methodologies

ICVCM assessment status and decisions for Carbon Credit Categories are published on the <u>ICVCM</u> <u>website</u>. To be eligible for CCP labels, VCUs must have been issued to projects using the eligible methodologies and complying with any additional criteria listed on the <u>VCU Labels</u> webpage under "Market Labels".

Projects must demonstrate alignment with all applicable additional criteria in the Project Description or Monitoring Report, and have this information confirmed by the validation/verification body reviewing such reports. Where projects are using methodologies in a digital format on the <u>Verra Project Hub</u>, any fields related to applicable additional criteria for CCP eligibility must be completed. Projects that use multiple methodologies with a combination of eligible and ineligible methodologies are not eligible for CCP labels at this time.

Retired VCUs are eligible to receive a CCP label if all other eligibility criteria are met.

4 CCP LABEL PROCESS

Obtaining CCP Labels

Verra automatically labels eligible VCUs with CCP labels where sufficient information is available to confirm eligibility at the time of issuance or at the time of ICVCM approval of a given methodology.

Project proponents may also request CCP Labels during a project's verification approval request, or at any time thereafter, through the Verra Registry under 'Additional Certifications' on the project's Verification Summary page². The project proponent may apply for a CCP Label for each verification period for which VCUs are eligible.

A CCP label request will be assessed after the project's relevant verification is approved for VCU issuance. Verra assesses whether the eligibility criteria listed on the <u>VCU Labels</u> page are met before approving or rejecting the CCP label(s).

Approved CCP labels for VCUs will be publicly visible on the Verra registry.
