

AUGUST 2023 OVERVIEW OF VCS PROGRAM UPDATES AND EFFECTIVE DATES

Release Date: 29 August 2023

Last updated: 12 September 2023

This document provides an overview of the updates to the VCS Program rules and requirements released in August 2023 and the effective dates of these changes. The updates are listed in order of first appearance in the VCS Program rules and requirements.

Note: “Effective immediately” means that the update applies to all project requests submitted on or after the release date (29 August 2023).

For updates that are not effective immediately, project proponents may conform with updated requirements before the effective date. If project proponents choose to make such update ahead of the effective dates, the validation/verification body must validate or verify the project in accordance with the updated requirements.
